SOUTHEAST ASIA (REGIONAL) TILAPIA ASSOCIATION (SEATA) SIDE EVENT AGENDA



Jubilee Prestige Hotel Ratchadapisek Bangkok, Thailand November 3, 2025

The United States Soybean Export Council (USSEC) has long been a supporter of a growing, sustainable, feed-based aquaculture industry. Tilapia is a key production species globally, with over 7MMT of production, and Asia overall is the primary producer. USSEC has been an active participant in the further development of the tilapia sector, particularly in Southeast Asia, working to improve the industry directly through technical servicing, better feeds using sustainable US Soy products, and to help develop *national* tilapia associations. As the next step, USSEC (in conjunction with national tilapia associations and stakeholders) believes that a *regional* tilapia association may help to further advance the tilapia industry, by creating a "pre-competitive" organization that can seek to address key issues in the regional tilapia industry to improve production, efficiency, volumes, markets, and profitability – while still producing responsibly.

This side event is following a recent **Southeast Asia (Regional) Tilapia Association (SEATA) Roundtable** that was held in Singapore in October with representatives from Indonesia, Philippines, Thailand and Vietnam (as the primary tilapia producers in Southeast Asia) to discuss the possible formation of an regional association that would serve as a platform for producers, policymakers, researchers, and industry stakeholders across the region to exchange information, innovations, and best practices and help to accelerate technological adoption and problem-solving in tilapia aquaculture in a pre-competitive manner.
