FROZEN FISH:

• During the first quarter of 2024, global imports of frozen catfish, increased by 5.7%. Frozen fillets dominate the market despite a drop in total market share. China continued to be the largest importer by volume.

CHILLED AND FROZEN TUNA:

 Consumer demand for fresh tuna weakened worldwide because of the unusual hot weather. Import trends for frozen fillets remain positive. The FAD fishing closure in the Western and Central Pacific will limit raw material supplies during the July-September periods.

SHRIMP

• Shrimp prices in the international trade improves as supply shortfalls are felt in the producing countries. Demand for processed shrimp declined significantly in the European markets. Consumer demand in Southeast Asia remains stable throughout the year in favour of regional producers as imports increased across the Asia Pacific region in favour of Asian producers.

CANNED FISH

• Consumer demand for canned tuna increased in Malaysia as local marketers offer a wide range of value-added products to households.

World GLOBAL FISHERY PRODUCTION AND TRADE

According to FAO Statistics, the global fishery production (excluding aquatic plants and other animals) in 2022 has reached to 185.4 million MT, a 1.9% increase from the previous year. Aquaculture at 94.4 million MT, with a 3.9% increase comprised the 51% of the total global fishery production. This is the first time that aquaculture has surpassed the production from the capture fisheries. China dominated the aquaculture production followed by Indonesia, India, Vietnam and Bangladesh.

In 2023, world fishery exports have decreased by 6% and 4% in value and volume respectively compared to 2022. China remains the largest exporter despite the decline in the export value by 12.3%. The top 5 suppliers of fishery products to the global market are China (+0.03%), Norway (-5.8%), Russia (+12.7%), Vietnam (-7.8%) and Ecuador (+5.3%). Meanwhile, world fishery imports have declined by 7.3% and 5.7% at US\$ 166.6 billion and 31.970 million MT by value and volume respectively against the previous year. The United States of America remains the top importer by value despite the 10.8% decline, while China tops in terms of volume. The five major importers of fishery products are China with an increase of 11.4%, USA (-8.7%), Japan (-4.8%), Thailand (-10.8%) and Spain (-6.3%).

China/US FREIGHT RATES SOAR

Following the announcement of US President Joe Biden on new tariffs for Chinese goods to be implemented on 1st August 2024, Chinese exporters has been rushing in sending their products before the date. The rush to port has increased demand for containers causing the increase in freight rates and shipping delays. According to a container shipping analyst, container prices is to rise 88% over May and June.

Japan MARKET ALTERNATIVES AS CHINESE IMPORT BAN CONTINUES

Fishery exports in 2023 has decreased significantly following China's total ban on seafood imports from Japan in August 2023. Seafood export to China declined by 57% against the previous year. Japanese scallops in particular has been affected the most as it needs to replace its largest market and finding new locations to process scallops for export. In response to this, Japan has been aggressively promoting their scallops and other seafood products in global seafood shows, ran a campaign in America on CNN, held a tasting event in Brazil, among others. In order to maintain the US market, facilities that have obtained HACCP certification and ones that are registered with the US Food and Drug Administration in Taiwan, Thailand, and Vietnam have been identified. In addition, the Japan External Trade Organization (JETRO) is identifying processing hubs in other countries.

China/Malaysia CHINESE COMPANIES FOR A FISHERIES PROJECT IN MALAYSIA

The state of Kedah in, Malaysia has signed a cooperative agreement with Chinese companies to build the Kedah State Marine and Fisheries Economic Zone. The project will include port development and cold chain warehousing as well as aquaculture operations, according to a statement published by the Fujian provincial Ocean and Fisheries Bureau which is part of the China's mission to commit further cooperation with developing countries to develop aquaculture and wild-caught fisheries using Chinese know-how.

Live Groupers

Live marine food fish particularly groupers has been traded over the past decades. Sale of live groupers in the market for food dish have become very popular in Asia and some parts in Europe. In 2023, international trade on live grouper has increased significantly (+ 43%) at 16 104 MT compared to the previous year. The increase of supply of hybrid groupers in the market by 243% has been the cause of increased of the total import value by 25% and volume. Hong Kong continues to dominate imports.

Hong Kong

Total imports of live groupers in 2023 have increased significantly by 43% at 15 272 MT compared to 2022. Demand for live groupers in this market has improved significantly since the pandemic (2020) given Hong Kong's market share of 94.8% in global imports. The surge of tourists in Hong Kong particularly from mainland China has contributed to a significant rise in demand for live marine food fish in the hotel and restaurant trade. The most popular species is the hybrid grouper; the other varieties, comprised the 40.7% of the total live grouper imported in 2023.

Taiwan is the largest supplier of live grouper to Hong Kong at 7 135 MT, with a 46.7% market share. With Taiwan's increase in export to Hong Kong by 202%, it surpassed China among the top markets. Taiwan supplies hybrid, giant, green and tiger groupers, while China exports other varieties. China's export declines marginally as the country focused on the domestic market. Other main suppliers are the Philippines, Thailand, Indonesia, Malaysia, and the Maldives.

Frozen Catfish Imports

International trade of frozen catfish is shared dominantly by the *pangasius* species. According to FAO-Globefish, imports of frozen pangasius in 2023 was down by 25% from 2022. However, during the first quarter of 2024, total imports increased by 5.7% at 155 270 MT compared to the same period in 2023. Frozen whole catfish imports were up by 17%, increasing its market share to almost 9%. Frozen fillets continued to dominate the market despite the drop in marker share (from 82.2% to 80.3%).

Based on first quarter data on world imports, China remained the largest importer of frozen catfish in volume with a 21% market share despite the 26% decline in imports followed by the US, Brazil, Mexico, and Thailand since 2021. Other important markets were Colombia, the Philippines, the Netherlands, Singapore, UK and Germany.

Among the major markets of **frozen whole catfish**, a remarkable increase was seen in Saudi Arabia (+ 110% from 700 MT to 1 473 MT). Increases were also recorded in China (+14%), Colombia (+12.6%), and the USA (+19%). Meanwhile, imports in Mexico on the 3rd spot declined marginally (- 1%).

The increased imports of **frozen fillet catfish** were seen significantly in Brazil with a 82.4% rise. The other important markets where increases were recorded are the US (+31%), Thailand (+8.4%), Mexico (+33.8%). On the other hand, China's imports of frozen fillets declined by 42.7% causing the US to regain the top position since Q1 2021.

China

During the first quarter of 2024, total imports of catfish has declined by 26% at 32 631 MT compared to the same period in 2023 associated with the 42.7% import short fall in imports of frozen fillet, although whole frozen imports increased. China is trying to focus on its domestic market, pushing other low value whitefish, tilapia (local product) in the local market. This is in addition to the new Chinese tariffs in pangasius imports from Vietnam that causing the slowdown in imports. Vietnam was the lone supplier to China during Q1 in 2024.

Latin America

A total of 34 549 MT of frozen catfish was imported during Q1, in 2024, an increase of 37% compared to the same period last year. The region shares the 22% of the total frozen catfish imports with Brazil, Mexico and Colombia as the main importers. Domestic demand in Brazil continues to be strong, particularly for frozen fillet having an increase of 82.4%. Brazil is the third largest market for frozen catfish by volume. Vietnam is the largest supplier to Brazil, Mexico and Colombia.

Asia (excluding China)

In Asia, there was a 15.8% increase in frozen catfish imports at 33 704 MT. Main markets in Asia, not to include China, are Thailand, Philippines, Singapore, Malaysia, Hong Kong and Saudi Arabia. Frozen *pangasius* fillets are the most popular product in Southeast Asia; consumption has increased significantly since the product was introduced a decade ago according to FAO-Globefish.

Europe

The European Union imported 16 755 MT catfish during the first quarter of 2024 with a decrease in volume by 2.6% year-on-year. Imports mainly comprised of frozen fillet mostly originated from Vietnam. The UK, on the other hand, is the largest single importer in Europe despite the decline of 8.9% in supply. Vietnam is the main exporter to the UK with some supplies from Indonesia and Myanmar.

Sashimi and non-canned tuna trade

World

Summer demand for *sashimi* and non-*sashimi* tuna remains low in most of the markets worldwide. This trend is associated with the unusual hot weather in the Northern hemisphere that continues in the North America, the Northern part of South America, Europe, the Northern two-thirds of Africa, and most of Asia.

In the Far East Asia, overall demand for whole dressed tuna, fresh and frozen, has been weak during the summer months in comparison with last year, but remained stable for the ultra-frozen and shelf-stable tuna fillets. The trend is almost similar in the Western markets where the unusual hot weather is limiting outdoor activities including family picnics and dining outdoor, thereby impacting consumption trends of seafood products including tuna.

Japan

Consumption of raw tuna is generally avoided in Japan during the summer months, resulting slow trade in the fresh tuna market.

In anticipation of the low consumption during the summer months, overall imports of fresh and frozen tuna weakened in Japan but marginally (-1.8% at 84 432 MT) during January-May 2024. The 20% rise in the ultra-frozen fillet at 30 092 MT compensated the declines of fresh and frozen tuna imports during this period.

Raw materials for canning and other uses

Thailand

Thailand imported 319 929 MT of raw frozen tuna during January-May 2024, which is 8.5% higher than the same period in 2023. Imports of cooked frozen loins also increased by 20% at 26 780 MT during this period.

WCP

The three-months FAD fishing closure in the Western and Central Pacific (WCP) is in place from July, which will restrict supplies from this region till September. The delivery price of frozen skipjack to Thailand has started to firm up from June (1 450/MT) and may increase further during the FAD closure period.

Global supply

Farmed shrimp production in Asia is entering the second phase of the 2024 season in July. However, except for China, overall production in South and Southeast Asia has not improved much in comparison with last year's due to lack of recovery in exfarm and export prices during first half of the farming season.

In China, shrimp aquaculture through the greenhouse or covered farming that harvested nearly one million MT in 2023, is expected to continue; this will impact demand for imported shrimp in this market.

Large and steady supplies of *vannamei* shrimp from Ecuador at prices cheaper than Asian products, also forced farmers in India, Vietnam, Indonesia to shift to black tiger farming during the current aquaculture season. In Gujarat, the second largest farmed shrimp producing region in India, more than 90% farmers have moved to black tiger shrimp production during the 2024 aquaculture season, impacting overall supply of *vannamei* in the country.

International trade

Exports: In general, the international trade for shrimp in 2024 has been on a stale during the first half of the year affected by weak prices, lower production in Asia and weaker demand in the major markets. Exports from Ecuador, the top supplying country, declined by 22.3% during the first five months in 2024, including that of Indonesia (-12%) and Argentina (-15.7%), but increased from India, Vietnam, China and Thailand.

Imports: The trade data from January-May 2024 clearly shows the declines in global shrimp imports this year in most of the top markets. China the number one import market experienced the negative growth in imports during the first five months of the year. For China, the year 2024 started with strong imports in January but entered the two-digit negative growth period that persisted from February to April. Cumulative imports during January-May 2024 were 52 000 (-11.6%) lower in comparison with the previous year as domestic production increased.

During the first five months of 2024, shrimp imports in the USA were stable at the same level as last year's. Imports from the top supplier India increased by $4\,800\,MT$, at $110\,000\,MT$ (+4.5%) year-on-year, 74% of these imports was peeled shrimp.

In the European Union, shrimp imports declined by 8.3% year-on-year at 306 395 MT during January-May 2024. Imports of processed shrimp plummeted by 17% at 54 562 MT.

Consumer demand for shrimp has been stable the Asia -Pacific region in 2024 supported by strong demand during the Lunar New Year in February and the Spring festival in April. Cumulative imports during the first five months of the year were higher in Japan, Republic of Korea, Malaysia, Singapore, Hong Kong, Australia against the same period in 2023. The post-festival demand in these markets remains stable in favor of the regional shrimp farmers.

In India, export prices to the main market USA have started to improve from July in response to supply short falls of farmed *vannamei*. During mid-July, export deals for IQF *vannamei*, peeled & deveined were concluded at US\$ 4.40, 3.70, 3.45 and 3.25 per lb, for sizes 16/20 to 31/40 sizes, CFR Los Angeles, USA.

As reported earlier, majority shrimp farmers in the Gujarat state of India have moved away from *vannamei* to black tiger shrimp this year. In July, export deals of farmed black tiger have been concluded with European buyers (CFR France) at the following prices:

- a) Head-on black tiger, 1 kg semi-IQF packs at US\$ 8.45, US\$ 7.45 and US\$ 6.90, per kg for sizes 10/20, 20/30 and 30/40.
- b) Large sizes, headless_black tiger, 800gm packs per kg at US\$ 22.25, US\$16.90, US\$10.75/9.75 and US\$ 8.50 for sizes 4/6, 6/8, 8/12, 13/15 and 16/20.

Outlook

In Asia, production of farmed *vannamei* will be lower this year and increase for black tiger shrimp. However, any supply gap for *vannamei* could be easily met by Ecuador, particularly in the existing markets. Increased shrimp prices in the international trade may encourage Asian farmers to go for higher seeding of ponds for the second half of the year.

In China, the government's policy to boost domestic tourism is likely to keep local demand for shrimp stable in the country. The free trade agreement between Ecuador and China will allow more shrimp to enter this market from Ecuador in comparison with other sources.

The positive demand trend for shrimp in Southeast Asia will continue to absorb more shrimp in the regional markets.

Ecuador will push more shrimp to the US market European markets, particularly head-on and peeled shrimp.

In 2023, imports of dried sea cucumber (processed: cooked & dried), commonly called as *beche-de-mer* or *trepang* declined in volume by 15.5% at 6 442 MT while increased in value by 2.7% at US\$ 325 million compared to a year ago. Hong Kong is the main importer for *beche-de-mer* with 51.3% market share despite the 6.9% decline in the import volume. Main suppliers to Hong Kong include Nicaragua with 67% increase, Sri Lanka (-0.30%), Indonesia (-47%), Madagascar (+400%), Malaysia (-48%) and the Philippines (-39%). Hong Kong is the main importer as well as the re-exporter of dried sea cucumbers to China and Southeast Asia.

Malaysia <u>Canned Tuna</u>

Consumer demand for canned tuna increased significantly in Malaysia during the current year particularly, for retail packs of value-added products. The two leading local brands (*TCBoy* and *Ayam*) have added a wide variety of value-added products in the retail trade in Malaysia. Canned tuna with 'lemon and pepper', 'garlic and herbs', in 'curry sauce', sandwich spreads of different flavors, packed in 95gm to 150gm cans are the popular items occupying broader space on supermarket shelves in the capital city and other large metropolises.

In the recent years, demand for canned tuna in Malaysian households shifted from 'tuna in brine' to 'tuna in oil' including for healthy products such as tuna in 'organic olive oil', in 'extra-virgin olive oil' including the MSC (Marine Stewardship Council) certified brands. The retail prices of these products range from US\$1.30 to US\$1.85 per can.

Local demand for canned and processed tuna in Malaysia, is generally met through imports. During the first quarter of 2024, imports reached a record level. China took over Thailand as the leading exporter during this period. Vietnam became a newcomer in the supply chain since 2023.
