## FRESH FISH:

- In Q1 2025, U.S. imports of fresh/chilled fish totaled 59 381 MT, reflecting a stable but evolving market with a slight year-on-year decline.

## FROZEN FISH:

- Global tilapia imports reached a five-year high of 149 091 in the Q1 of 2025

## CHILLED AND FROZEN TUNA:

- Western Pacific tuna catches slow as the FAD closure begins in July 2025. In Japan, sashimi tuna demand may drop if tourist arrivals decline due to the July earthquake.

## SHRIMP:

- Shrimp trade was stable during the first half of 2025 supported by increased imports in the USA. However, farmed shrimp imports in China are yet to recover. The punitive high tariff in the USA causes serious concerns in the export trade.

## CANNED FISH:

- USA - the single largest importer of ready-to-eat tuna had record high imports during January-March 2025. Supplies increased from most sources.

**GLOBAL****VANNAMEI SHRIMP PRICES CONTINUES, UPWARD TRAJECTORY**

Global farm-gate prices for *vannamei* shrimp rose in week 30 (July 21–27), driven by reduced supply from disease outbreaks and the end of peak harvests in some regions. However, this trend does not apply to Asia, where peak production runs from August to October. The Undercurrent News Global Shrimp Index for 60-count *vannamei* reached \$3.71/kg—a 15.9% increase year-on-year—despite ongoing tariff uncertainties. Ahead of August 1, several countries secured lower US tariffs: Indonesia at 19% and Vietnam at 20%, down from 32%.

**JAPAN****15% US-TARIFF RATE SECURED IN TRUMP TRADE DEAL**

After high-stakes negotiations concluded in Washington, DC, this week, Japan has secured a 15% tariff rate in its latest trade agreement with this US. This marks the lowest level among all new rates announced by President Donald Trump.

**VIETNAM****EU EMERGES AS STABLE PANGASIUS MARKET AMID U.S. TARIFF DISRUPTIONS**

Vietnam remains cautiously optimistic about a recovery in the second half of 2025. While some in the seafood sector feared pangasius would be more severely impacted than shrimp, the U.S.—Vietnam's second-largest market after China—remains critical. However, ongoing tariff disruptions have pushed exporters to look toward Europe for greater stability. The Vietnam Association of Seafood Exporters and Producers (VASEP) has expressed optimism, citing the EU's solid performance as a pangasius market in the first half of 2025.

**INDONESIA****GDST STANDARD ADOTED FOR SEAFOOD DATA PLATFORM**

The Indonesian government has launched a new mandatory digital reporting system for members of the country's biggest seafood supply chains. Since last year 2024, they have made it a legal requirement for producers and processors of shrimp, skipjack tuna and swimming crab to enter all sales and product data into its digital Stelina database while it looks to re-enter the EU's list of trusted importers before next year's deadline.

**PACIFIC****MILESTONE AGREEMENT ON SOUTH PACIFIC ALBACORE ALLOCATION STRENGTHENS REGIONAL TUNA MANAGEMENT**

In a landmark development for Pacific fisheries, officials reached a consensus on a long-standing issue of the South Pacific Albacore (SPA) tuna allocation within the Exclusive Economic Zones (EEZ's) of the Pacific Islands Forum Fisheries Agency (FFA) members. This breakthrough emanates after almost two decades of negotiations, representing a historic progression in regional fisheries cooperation. Although the SPA stock remains healthy, declining catch rates have affected the economic viability of this fishery especially for the PI domestic fleets. This agreement ensures management decisions consider stock health and economic viability alike of the southern long line fishery

GUINEA****SEAFOOD HUB LAUNCHED IN CHINA**

The National Fisheries Authority (NFA) of Papua New Guinea (PNG) has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Guangzhou Aquatic Products Chamber of Commerce for the direct export of PNG's seafood. This cooperation builds on a 2019 Trade Protocol Agreement (TPA) signed in Apia Samoa, during the 3<sup>rd</sup> Pacific Islands Fisheries Development and Cooperations forum enabling PNG direct market access to China after years of exporting via third party countries.

**United States**

In the first quarter of 2025, the U.S. imported 59 381 MT of fresh or chilled fish; a slight 0.1% decline from 2024 and 4.4% below the 2022 peak, reflecting a stable yet evolving market shaped by shifting species dynamics.

Atlantic salmon imports continued to decline, likely influenced by diversification efforts and sustainability considerations. In contrast, tilapia saw strong year-on-year growth of 27%, driven by its affordability, while sea bass imports surged by 76.9% since 2021, reflecting recovery in the premium dining sector. Yellowfin tuna experienced a modest rebound after a dip in 2024, whereas the broader fresh fish category declined by 7.8%, potentially due to reduced species diversity or reclassification. These trends occurred amid increasing Asian-sourced imports, a growing divide between high-value and budget-friendly species, and a market increasingly shaped by seasonal demand patterns, tariff shifts, and changing consumer preferences.

In the first quarter of 2025, global tilapia imports reached a five-year high of 149 091 MT, up 26.8% from 2024, driven by strong growth in frozen fillets and whole frozen tilapia, reflecting a continued global preference for frozen forms due to cost, shelf life, and distribution advantages.

The United States (54 309 MT) and Mexico (39 291 MT) remained the leading importers, with notable increases in demand from Côte d'Ivoire, Colombia, and Costa Rica. U.S. tilapia imports alone rose by 33.2%, the highest in five years, with frozen products accounting for 87% of the volume. This surge, supported by Asian suppliers and inflation-driven demand for affordable proteins, reinforces tilapia's position as a key low-cost seafood option, with strong potential for growth in private-label frozen products, institutional supply, and ready-to-cook meal solutions.

**Japan**

The post Golden-week demand for fresh and frozen tuna in Japan seafood business (*sashimi* and others) remained stable throughout June and July, particularly within the restaurant and catering sectors. This steady trend was largely supported by the continued influx of foreign tourists during this period.

According to the Japan National Tourism Organization, the country received 21.5 million foreign visitors during January-June 2025, which is much higher than the forecast of 17.78 million for this period. Most of the tourists were from the Southeast Asia and Far East regions, namely the Republic of Korea (4.8 million), China (+ 53.5 percent at 4.7 million), and Taiwan (3.3 million).

This stable trend was expected to continue into the second half of the year, supported by increased tourist arrivals from July to October. However, the recent 8.8-magnitude earthquake off Russia's Far Eastern Kamchatka coast, which triggered tsunami warnings in Japan, may lead to potential disruptions in the overall catering and foodservice industry.

Another factor impacting domestic consumers in Japan is the price increase of 2,000 food items starting in July 2025. According to private research firm Teikoku Databank, prices for over 200 products in Japanese supermarkets - particularly processed foods such as pre-cooked rice, pasta sauces, and others are also set to rise.

During the first half of 2025, Japan imported 148 904 MT of fresh and frozen tuna in which 60-70 % was the higher value tuna species. Total imports of fresh and frozen tuna increased by 13% year-on-year.

**Toyosu Fish Market**

In June, total landings of fresh and frozen tuna in the auction market were 2 953 MT in comparison with 3 659 MT in May. Supplies of frozen bigeye and yellowfin in the market decreased considerably during this period.

**USA**

Consumer demand in the U.S. non-canned tuna market remained steady, with year-on-year imports of fresh and frozen whole dressed and fillet products rising 18% to 46,174 MT in the first five months of 2025.

## China

Demand for high-value, non-canned tuna remains strong in China, particularly among the large Japanese restaurant chains, with increased interest in both fresh air-flown tuna and frozen tuna fillets. Fresh tuna imports rose by 35% in the first half of 2025, reaching 693 MT. Atlantic bluefin tuna, primarily sourced from the Mediterranean, accounted for the majority at 573 MT, followed by Southern bluefin tuna from Australia at 109 MT. With the recent lifting of restrictions on seafood imports from Japan, further growth in supply from these sources is anticipated in the coming months.

## Raw Materials for Canning and Other Uses

In Thailand, overall imports of whole frozen tuna for reprocessing were 25% lower than last year's January-June, associated with large shortfall in frozen skipjack imports; frozen yellowfin and albacore imports increased during this period year-on-year. Thai tuna packers also continue replacing whole frozen tuna with semi-processed cooked loins to produce end products. During January-June 2025, cooked loin imports in Thailand reached 39 479 MT -- a 16% increase year-on-year with China, Indonesia and Viet Nam as the main suppliers.

## Outlook

Overall tuna catches in the Western and Central Pacific Ocean are expected to remain low through September due to the three-month FAD fishing closure that began in July. This is likely to keep tuna prices firm in the coming months.

In Japan, the recent earthquake that struck the Pacific region in July may dampen foreign tourist arrivals, falling short of earlier projections. This may affect restaurant operators who had already stocked up in anticipation of strong demand during the July–August holiday season.

**SHRIMP**

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**International trade**

The global shrimp trade has grown increasingly vulnerable due to the threat of high tariffs in the U.S. market, particularly affecting products of Asian origin. US shrimp imports increased significantly in June from most sources to avoid high tariff from July (as announced earlier). Imports also increased in the Asia Far East and in Europe during the first half of 2025. Nonetheless, the top market, China, continues to import less and export more, supported by increased production of farmed shrimp in the country.

As of January-May 2025, shrimp exports increased from most sources. In Southeast Asia's producing countries, local demand for shrimp also remains stable at attractive prices.

While European demand for shrimp remains sluggish with high inventories, US purchases have had a stabilizing effect on global shrimp prices during the first half of 2025.

**China**

Seasonal production of farmed *vannamei* shrimp has been stable in China during the second quarter of the year supported by good domestic demand during the summer holiday months of June-July.

Monthly imports of shrimp in June 2025 increased by 9.69% at 91 811 MT in comparison with May 2025 as imports of cold-water shrimp increased from Canada, Argentina and Greenland. Nonetheless cumulative imports during January-June 2025 were 2.81% lower year-on year. Shrimp exports from the top suppliers Ecuador, India, Thailand to China were also lower compared to the same period last year.

## USA

Shrimp traders in the United States increased purchasing activity in June to get ahead of potential changes in the national tariff policy. This move reflects uncertainty surrounding import duties, especially for Asian-origin products. For Indian shrimp, the tariff was at 10% till July. The revised tariff of 25% will be effective from 1 August 2025.

During January-May 2025, cumulative shrimp imports in the USA were 11.43% higher at 341 448 MT. Nearly 50% (167 903 MT) of these was semi-processed raw frozen peeled shrimp, supplied by India, Ecuador, Indonesia, Viet Nam and others. Processed shrimp accounted for 22% (76,748 MT) of total imports, making the U.S. the top importer by value, while China led in terms of import volume.

## European Union

Shrimp imports in the European Union improved marginally during the second quarter of 2025 as marketers procured supplies in preparation of the high consumption period (June-August). January-May 2025 imports were 329 256 MT in comparison with 325 744 MT imported a year ago.

There were increased imports in Spain, France, Germany, Portugal, and Greece but declined in the Netherlands, Italy, Denmark and Poland. Imports in the Eastern European region also remained subdued, impacted by the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war.

## Asia/Pacific

Japan ranks as the second-largest import market of shrimp in the Asia-Pacific region after China. In anticipation of the summer holiday season and a surge in foreign tourist arrivals this year, Japan imported nearly 100,000 MT of shrimp between January and June—marking its highest mid-year volume in five years. The top suppliers that benefited from this development were Viet Nam, India, Indonesia, Thailand and Ecuador. However, due to the earthquake in the Far East Russia and the resulting tsunami threat to Japan, the number of foreign tourists is expected to fall short of earlier forecasts in the near term. This is likely to lead to inventory build-up in the market, subsequently slowing import demand in the second half of the year.

Other key markets in the Asia Far East and Near East include the Republic of Korea, Malaysia, Taiwan, Hong Kong and Singapore. Shrimp imports in these markets increased during the first half of 2025 to meet demand from the retail and foodservice sectors.

Demand for raw frozen shrimp for export processing also increased this year in Viet Nam and Thailand in favour of exports in India and Ecuador. This trend is likely to continue during the second half of 2025.

## Outlook

Production of farmed shrimp in Asia is approaching the seasonal peak during August, September and October. However, the high tariff barriers in the USA and declining imports from China pose significant challenges - particularly for South Asian producers with limited domestic market opportunities. The seasonal increase in supply is also expected to exert downward pressure on shrimp prices.

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**USA: Canned Tuna Trade**

As a single market, the United States remains the leading importer of ready-to-eat canned and other prepared tuna products. Imports saw a strong recovery in the first quarter of 2025, rising by 25.5% compared to the same period in 2024. At 64 512 MT; this marked a five-year high for the period.

Thailand maintained its leading position as the top exporter with a 50% market share, followed by Viet Nam and Ecuador. All three countries recorded historically high export volumes, with Ecuador posting a notable 72.97% increase.
